I cannot thank you enough for my childcare scholarship and the support you have offered my family."

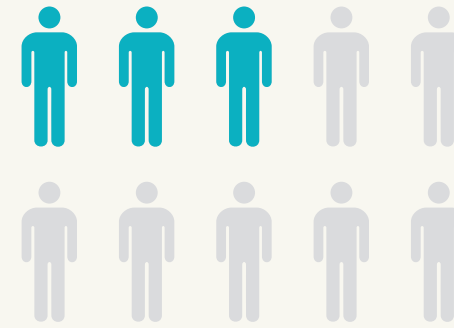
CHILD CARE SCHOLARSHIP

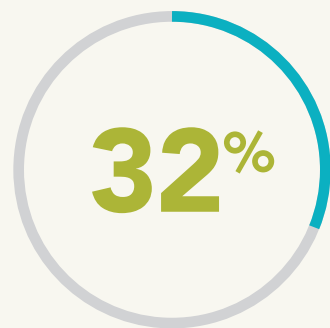

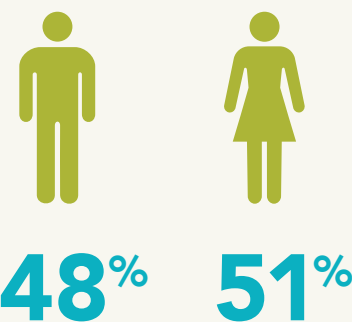

Since that time, SOL has awarded more than 150 scholarships.

GEORGE PUENTES JR. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

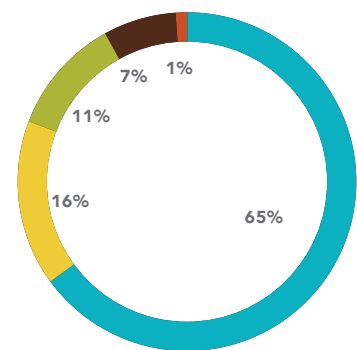

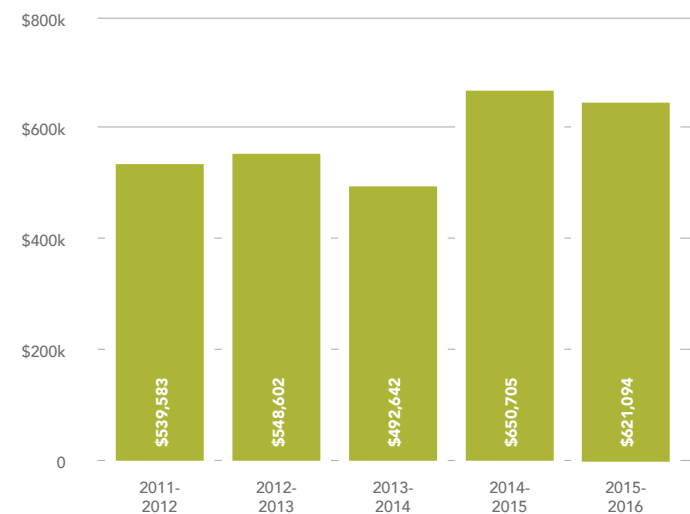
